

Recommendations for on-going and future capacity building efforts from the 2016 Capacity Assessment include:

- Consolidate and coordinate the efforts of the coalitions in the county and communities.
- Continue to strengthen the shared leadership model for the coalition to increase buy-in among coalition members.
- Work with stakeholders to develop plans or systems such as a shared file system such as Google Docs to retain knowledge and experience and to communicate internal sustainability systems already in place.

Park County Underage Drinking and Youth Marijuana



Alcohol Use - Past 30 Day Use Percent of students who consumed beer, wine, sweetened or hard liquor in the past 30 days




Access


Perception of Harm & Risk










